
Recommended Walking & Jogging Routes

Northeast Loop

This route is a 3.5 mile loop through downtown, U of M Flint, the Flint Cultural Center, Kearsley Park, Davton Park and the Farmers Market. Over half of the route is on the Flint River Trail along the Flint River. The other portion is along South Saginaw Street and East Kearsley Street in the downtown area. This trip will generally take around 70 minutes to walk, assuming there are few delays.

Southwest Loop

This route is a 2.6 mile loop through the downtown, Historic Carriage Town District and Kettering University. Half of the route is on the Flint River Trail along the Flint River. The other half follows East Chevrolet Avenue, University Avenue and South Saginaw Street. This trip will generally take around 50 minutes to walk, assuming there are few delays.



Applewood

The 34-acre historic estate of the Charles Stewart Mott family features stately trees, lush lawns and flower gardens. As part of the Ruth Mott Foundation's commitment to Flint, special programs for the public are offered throughout the year. www.applewood.org

The Longway Planetarium

Claims the title of Michigan's largest planetarium with 285 seats under a 60-foot dome. The Learning Center provides hands-on science, astronomy and telescope opportunities. www.longway.org

The Whiting Auditorium

Provides facilities, programs and services that promote and support the presentation of the best regional, national and international performing artists. It hosts broadway shows, music, dance, theatre, comedy and much more. www.thewhiting.com

Flint Institute of Arts

Houses over 8,500 pieces of art from around the world spanning 5,000 years. Open seven days a week. No fee for the permanent collection. Nominal fee for other exhibits. www.flintarts.org
