

The three trails will likely account for the vast majority of trail work in Macomb County for the foreseeable future, but there are other active projects in Oakland County. 80% was seen as an appropriate percentage to allocate towards the three trail projects from the total allocated to the two counties (almost all of Macomb's allotment and about 65% of Oakland's allotment).

Adjustment Factor:

As the three trails have been identified as the top regional priority, they should be eligible for a greater portion of the funds beyond the baseline budget for yearly funding based on population; 25% was deemed an appropriate amount. The degree to which Oakland and Macomb Counties and the rest of the region acknowledge this priority and reflect that acknowlegement in other applications from the region the more likely special prority will be given by the funders. The GWI fund was reduced by 25% given the relative ability of the area to support the finance of the trail.

Please Note:

This worksheet is a strategic planning tool for funding a trail or greenway; it by no means indicates likely amounts that will be allocated towards these projects by the funding sources indicated. TEA-21, NRTF, and GWI are competitive programs and each application will be judged on its own merits and in comparison to other applications submitted for the same period. The percentage generally allocated towards trail projects is based on past practices and programs and there is no certainty that these patterns will continue as each fund evaluates its funding criteria yearly. None of the funds uses an allocation based on population, therefore the resulting numbers do not reflect funding source policies.
